Committee Reports

Pie Sale

New Business

- Nominations for new board members will be in Jan/Feb. Julie coordinates.
- Lengthy discussion about pasta dinner on 2/14. Kickoff meeting will be announced. Major logistical decisions need to be made.

- Need a chair for the auction, making baskets, coordinating donations. Past years' chairs cannot do it again but will advise. (No one at meeting volunteered.)
- If events remain on the same night, cross promote Drama Club One-Acts and Pasta Dinner ticket sales, so people see info about both events. Need to sell tickets separately, using two different ticket sales systems.
- We should consider moving to online bidding for baskets to increase profits. Joe
 Ferencie knows how to do it, but he is busy with one-acts that night. Someone would
 need to learn it from him. Need to have baskets donated and baskets made well in
 advance of event to do online bidding. Concerns shared about poor internet access in
 cafeteria.
- Ideas discussed to get marketing/business students from CSU or John Carroll to plan and market events. Someone would need to supervise. Colleges need more lead time to get a student to fill a project need, think ahead for next year.
- How to get parents to donate? Problem is same parents who donate will then attend dinner and purchase baskets, not reaching new supporters. MIM requires a minimum \$25 donation per student for our auction, parents can get a donation or buy gift cards, helps ensure large response for auction items. If even a percentage of parents in choirs, bands, and orchestras participated, we would have more than enough, even if people only donated \$5. Request for items needs to go out before winter break. Directors can have a collection basket in their offices. Directors can still have music sections responsible for creating baskets, plus ask for donations.
- Should we even do the auction? If we ask people to donate money, we could make more than the auction would have made for less work.
- Idea to invite other local jazz bands, do it as a festival. Sell tickets to a jazz band festival, light refreshments. Can't do jazz band performance in auditorium because of One Acts. Might have to move the date to have more time.
